This monograph will be part of the congress documents and will be handed out to every participant of the congress. The authors of the different chapters describing the situation of child and adolescent psychiatry in their respective countries have been asked to serve as ESCAP Congress Zonal Representatives who will add to the programme the specific issues and problems of their countries and regions.



## Programme Highlights

The 11<sup>th</sup> International ESCAP Congress is located at the transition from the 20<sup>th</sup> to the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Remarkable changes in every field of life have taken place during the last decades and the life of children and families has deeply been influenced by these changes. Under the heading „New Challenges, New Solutions“ the Hamburg ESCAP congress will analyze current challenges in all important fields of child mental health and try to find perspectives for the future. The highlights of the congress will reflect these perspectives in different ways:

- The invited **ESCAP lectures** given by distinguished researchers and clinicians will open the programme each day by highlighting a major topic with reference to the congress theme.
- The **State of the art lectures** will present the recent development in a certain area with special focus on the congress theme.
- The **Poster symposia** concentrated on recent empirical research will have a major position at the congress in order to stimulate especially young researchers to present their results. There will be three poster prizes for the best posters proposed by the poster jury.
- The **ESCAP courses** devoted to topics of practical relevance and given by distinguished experts are part of the educational programme and will give an excellent opportunity for learning new facts and treatment procedures.
- There will be a special **EFPT-Forum** organized by the European Federation for All Psychiatric Trainees (EFPT) with the opportunity to exchange information about training, research and cooperation.
- The **Student Tutorship Programme**. ESCAP appreciates young academic colleagues in child and adolescent psychiatry. A novelty of this congress is the student tutorship programme. Interested students of medicine and psychology, especially those who are currently working on their doctoral or masters theses, are especially welcome to attend the congress (please refer to page 23).
- The **Congress topics** will cover the whole field of child, adolescent and family mental health issues with special focus on the following questions: What is new? What is based on empirical research? What are the challenges in a given field? Which solutions are possible? Which are the ethical and legal implications?
- **Congress on teaching psychiatric pupils**: Simultaneously with the ESCAP congress the staff of the hospital school in cooperation with Hamburg University and other organizations plans to organize a satellite congress on teaching psychiatric pupils. We strive to connect both events to give all those interested who work in this field the opportunity to participate in both events.
- **Exhibition** of paintings and drawings: German children and adolescents will present their „image of family“ to our foreign guests.
- **Congress-night-out**: Meet us for dinner, dance and performances. Come and be entertained by Hamburg's young artists performing a capella singing, pantomime and swing (please refer to page 18).

## Congress Information

### Format descriptions:

There are different formats for the presentations at the 11th International ESCAP congress. Before selecting a format, please read carefully the instructions to determine which is most appropriate for your presentation. The deadline for all submissions is February 15<sup>th</sup>, 1999.

### Symposia:

Symposia sessions last 120 minutes and focus on a specific topic, representing several points of view. There are Invited Symposia and Proposed Symposia. The organizer of the symposium chairs the session, which includes a maximum of six papers and a period for audience discussion. All participants must formally have agreed to participate prior to submission of the proposal. The organizer of a symposium is requested to collect all submission forms of the respective contributors (form D) and submit them together with the submission form for the proposer (form C). Only complete submissions will be reviewed. In order to facilitate the international character of the symposia, there should not be more than two speakers from the same country.

### Poster Symposia:

Poster symposia are planned every day between 10.30 a.m. and 12.00. The poster walls, which are two white plastic-coated boards, have the following size: width 1,00 metres x height 2,50 metres as measured from the floor.

For the attachment of the poster to this wall, please make sure that your poster does not exceed the above mentioned dimensions. Material for the attachment is available in the poster area.

The poster should have the following structure: Objective, methods, results, conclusions, references. The poster exhibition will be **permanent for the whole congress** with the opportunity for all participants to study the posters several times. Poster symposia are designed for a short and intensive discussion of the posters. For that reason, every author of a poster is requested to bring 100 handouts (DinA4) of his poster in order to distribute them for the discussion at the poster symposium and a transparency with the main results. Poster symposia are chaired by experienced experts and are highly estimated at this congress. This is expressed also by their central position within the congress programme.

### Workshops:

Workshop sessions last 120 minutes. They should deal with topics of special interest to child and adolescent psychiatry, using multiple, brief presentations of not more than 60 minutes, followed by approximately 60 minutes of discussion. Again, there should not be more than two speakers from one country.

### Courses:

These 240 minutes sessions present advanced material on a chosen topic putting special emphasis on the practical aspects. Courses are designed to emphasize learning experience and active involvement of the participants. Registrants receive handouts, annotated bibliographies, and instructions for the everyday practice. The courses are carried out by one or two internationally recognized experts of the chosen topic who are specially invited. Participants will receive a certificate.

**Fees are charged separately for the courses: 70,- DM per course.**

#### Video Sessions:

A special room will be reserved for video sessions which are 60 minutes long and present videotapes on a special chosen topic (e.g., psychopathology, diagnostics, therapy) with 20 minutes discussion included. The format of the videotapes must be: **VHS, S-VHS, BETACAM-SP.**

The system of the videotapes must be: **PAL, NTSC, SECAM.**

The video for PC data projection must be with a **minimum** resolution of **640 x 480** or **800 x 600**.

#### Free Communications:

There will be the possibility for a limited number of free communications. The scientific committee takes the liberty to either integrate them into symposia or to accept them as posters.

### General Instructions for Submissions

1. **Review „Format Description“** to determine the proper presentation format for the proposed offering (see page 12).
2. **Review and prepare the items required** as noted under „Essentials for all proposals“.
3. Complete **one form for each submission** and **indicate the type** of submission.
4. Complete the appropriate submission form(s):
  - Type all copies.
  - Limit entries on form(s), including spaces between words, to the number of character spaces provided.
  - Note the number of character spaces provided.
  - Be sure that the abstracts reflect appropriateness to the format.



## **Essentials for All Proposals**

### **Abstracts**

Together with your submission of Symposia, Workshops or Free Communications you have to present an abstract:

An abstract of maximum 200 words is required for each proposal submitted. The abstract is a concise description of the specific purpose, content, methodology, results and importance of the proposed presentation. Specific findings and inferences should be stated explicitly. Include a concluding statement to provide a strong summary for the abstract.

- The title of the presentation should clearly reflect the relevant information included in the abstracts. Titles should not be more than 50 characters.
- Abstracts **for reports of research** must include the following information under the headings indicated: *Objective* – questions addressed by the study; *Method* – design of the study, setting (location and level of clinical care), patients or participants (manner of selection and number who entered and completed the study), interventions (if any), main outcome measures (primary study outcome measures as planned before data collection); *Results* – key findings; and *Conclusions* – including direct clinical applications.
- Abstracts **for review articles** must include the following information under the headings indicated: *Objective* – the primary purpose of the review article; *Method* – data sources, study selection (the number of studies selected for review and how they were selected), data extraction (rules for abstracting data and how they were applied); *Results* – methods of data synthesis, key findings; and *Conclusions* – including potential applications and research needs. For papers discussing philosophical issues rather than research, include why the issue is important; how the issue is approached (e.g. based upon clinical experience, literature review, etc.); and the implications of the thesis of the paper.

### **References**

Each proposed presentation must not include more than two literature references.

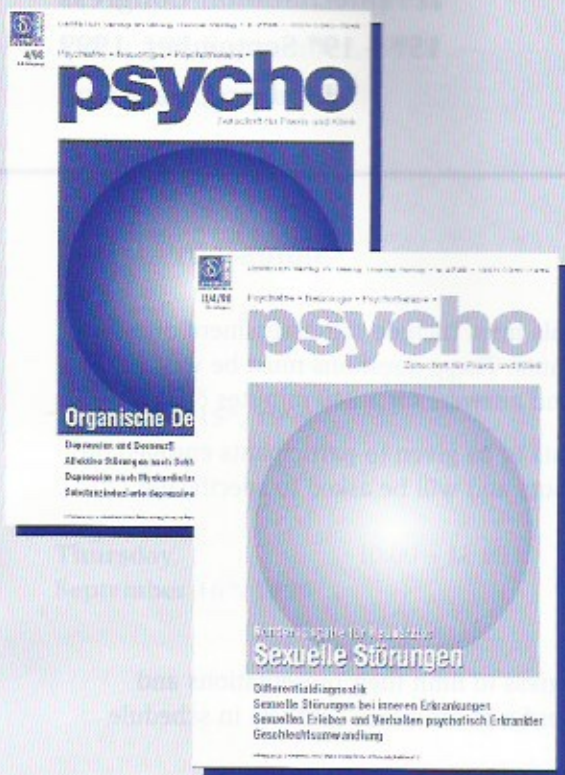

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### **Essentials for Courses Only**

**Self-Assessment Questions and Answers** – Course proposals must include self-assessment questions and answers to evaluate the learning outcomes of the participants. These questions must be written in multiple choice or true-false format. Submit four questions and answers for a 240 minutes course.

**Handout Materials** – Course Directors must prepare handouts to be given to participants enrolled on their courses. Participants will expect to receive useful handouts and will be asked to specifically evaluate them.

### **Number of Presentations**

The Scientific Committee encourages participants at the Congress to limit their presentations and participation to no more than **three** during the Congress, in order to minimize conflicts in schedule and to give the opportunity for others to present papers.

### **Preparation of Abstracts**

All abstracts must be prepared in English. The Programme and Abstract Books will be published in English only. Incomplete submissions of abstracts will not be considered. Selected papers will be published in the proceedings.

### **Publication of Proceedings**

The European Society for Child and Adolescent Psychiatry retains the right to publish all material presented at the Congress.

### **Technologies of Presentation**

Twin projection and overhead projection are available in all rooms. Participants should contact the Congress Office concerning further questions related to the technological support for their presentation.

### **Languages of the Congress**

English will be used in every session of the Congress.

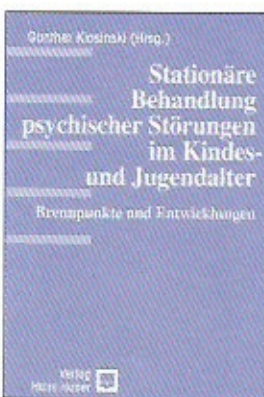

## General information

### Hamburg

Hamburg has many faces: it is a centre of trade and industry, a port city, a media metropolis, a university city, an arts centre, a shopping paradise and a leisure capital.

Hamburg is Germany's second biggest city (following Berlin), with a population of 1.7 million. One of the major factors in its international significance is its port, and the worldwide trading links associated with it. The city itself is over a thousand years old, and the port celebrated its 800<sup>th</sup> anniversary in 1989.

Trade and industry are particularly prominent here. Hamburg is home to many large German companies and numerous foreign corporations, making it Germany's leading centre for foreign trade. Its range of industries is extremely broad, including aerospace (second only to Seattle in aircraft production), electrical and mechanical engineering, food and beverages, the coffee, tea and tobacco industries and many, many more. It is a leading major banking and insurance centre.

Hamburg is a lively centre of international diplomatic activities – with 94 consulates and consulates – general (1996), it has recently recaptured the lead from New York.

And that is not all. Hamburg is also Germany's media capital with a strong presence of the magazine and newspaper press, TV, radio, new media, PR and advertising.

Abstract:	<p><b>Objective:</b> Underweight is a core feature of anorexia nervosa (AN). We hypothesize that new insights into this eating disorder can be derived by focussing on weight aspects in AN.</p> <p><b>Methods:</b> For this purpose we address:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1.) the prognostic significance of the BMI at referral</li><li>2.) the influence of premorbid body weight on the BMI at referral</li><li>3.) longitudinally evaluate leptin levels during weight gain and renewed weight loss</li><li>4.) assess the relationship between leptin secretion and the reproductive axis and</li><li>5.) finally consider genes relevant in weight regulation as candidate genes in molecular genetic studies of adolescent patients with eating disorders.</li></ol> <p><b>Results:</b> Patients with referral BMIs <math>&lt; 13 \text{ kg/m}^2</math> have a poor weight prognosis. Their premorbid BMI is correlated to the BMI at referral. Leptin levels are exceedingly low prior to weight gain; however, after weight gain levels top those of BMI-matched controls. Screening of several genes involved in weight regulation revealed no functionally relevant mutations predisposing to the development of AN.</p> <p><b>Conclusions:</b> Weight is of major clinical importance in AN. As of today, there is no evidence that AN in genetic terms can be perceived as a weight disorder.</p>



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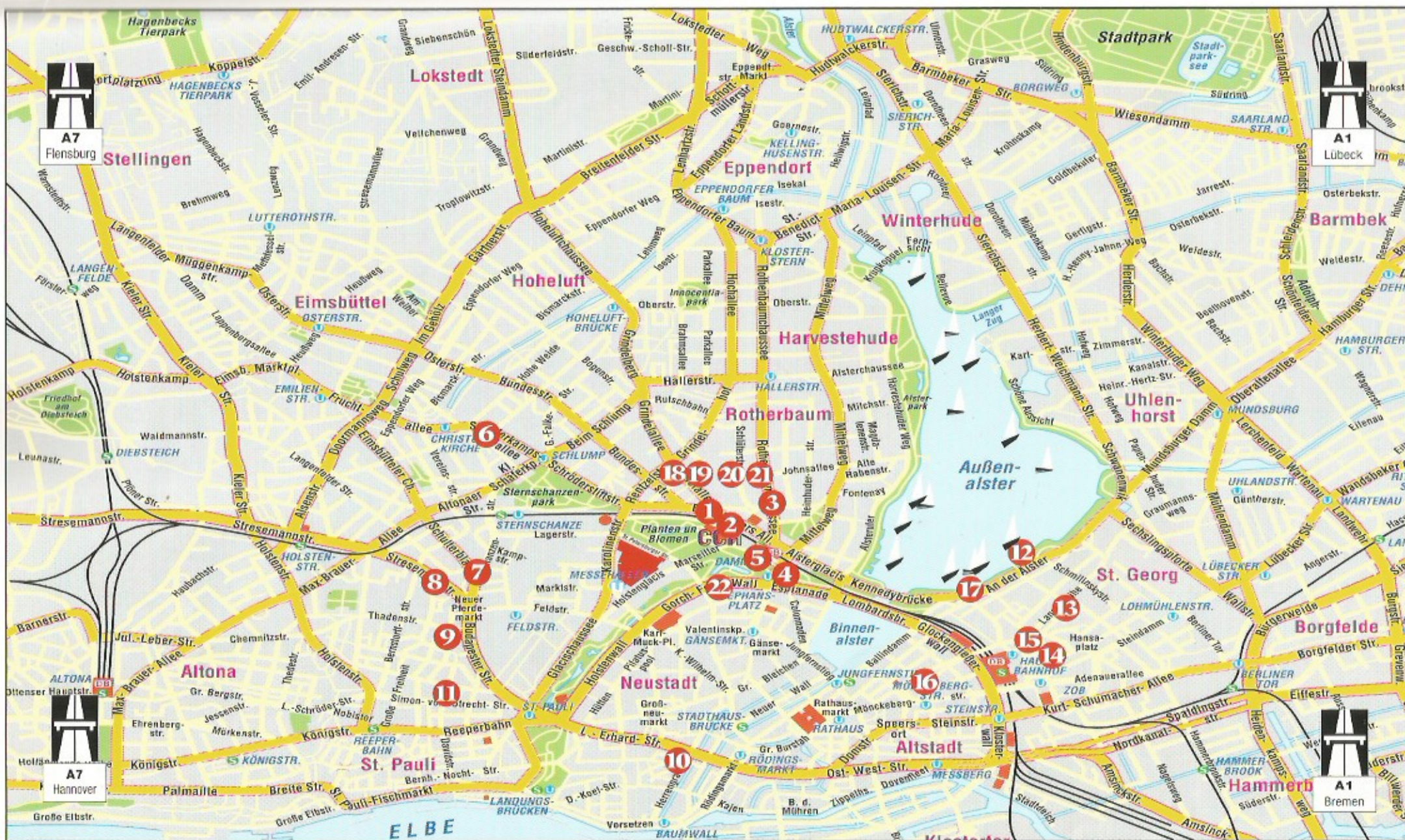
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
